Senior Center keeping mind & body active, serving commuity through Meals on Wheels

The Union County Senior Center is bustling with numerous activities for Union County residents who have lived sixty years or longer. The atmosphere is welcoming for those who have made it part of their life and for those who drop in occasionally.

"They usually come for the socialization, but soon realize we offer a little bit of everything to keep their mind active, their body active, to help them live in their home without having to go to a nursing home as soon as some people would," said Kathy Hill, director of the center. "The activities are ways for them to express themselves and it makes them feel good about themselves."

Activities include exercise classes, quilting, woodcarving, painting with acrylic and drawing with pencil, games, a pool table, computer time, plus sitting and relaxing with good conversation or reading.

Meals are served midday during weekdays to those at the center. Home delivered meals are distributed in the community.

Exercise, geared to various age groups and physical situations, includes Silver Sneaker, cardio-circuit, classic chair exercise class, tai chi, yoga, line dancing and other ideas. Ladies sit around a loom and quilt the traditional way, hand stitching one stitch at a time, which means there could be several different styles

of stitching in each Kathy Hill quilt, giving it individual character.

"People just do not realize how much effort is put into quilting," said Kathy.

They quilt special orders for people and others are sold after being completed.

Volunteers assist with the paint program, working one-on-one until a person is able to continue themselves. Paintings consist of landscapes, people, flowers, people and others. Items made at the center are sold with the money going back into the center to purchase more supplies.

The Meals on Wheels program utilizes about 30 volunteers each week day to take meals to elderly people who are unable to prepare meals for themselves. The meals are catered in through a food vendor. The volunteers pack them out to deliver them on six routes. Funding for Meals On Wheels includes funding from federal, state and county funds. The balance is raised through donations

and items sold at the center.

A grant allowed the center to add rooms and expand the kitchen, doubling the number of people served. The location is

ideal, sharing a driveway with the college off Hwy. 515. It is close to town, yet due to the buffer of trees the traffic noise is kept out. Being next to hiking trails (known as the dog park for walking pets) those at the center can see the people and pets. Large windows makes the building bright, aiding those with limited vision the ability to see. "The center works well with people with low vision," said Kathy.

Vans pick up people, the center coordinates day trips, and Friday is shopping day with several stops.

The center has an Alzheimer Respite Program twice a week, allowing the caregiver to bring the individual they care for to the center and leave them for three hours. They are offered singing, mind stimulating activities and games.
